## Meeting of Deans of Engineering from Latam and the Caribbean of LACCEI

The Face-to-Face Planning Meeting of Deans of Engineering of LAC of the Latin American and Caribbean Consortium of Engineering Institutions (LACCEI) is being held from May 30 to June 1 in San Padro Sula, Honduras, at the headquarters of the Technological University of Honduras. This will be a preliminary planning meeting to the companion First Face-to-Face Meeting of the Council of Deans of Engineering of ALyC of LACCEI to be held at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, Florida, USA.
