Under the coordination of Dr Catalina Aranzazu-Suescun, professor at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Arizona, USA, LACCEI launched its **first virtual HACKATHON** this year.

The hackathon aimed to allow undergraduate students from LACCEI member institutions and non-member institutions to advance in research, improve their critical thinking, and apply their knowledge to develop an innovative solution to an issue in the fields of medicine or the environment using the Internet of Things (IoT) systems.

The problem was contextualized in the location where the students coexist (university, house, community, etc). Our partner, **MathWorks**, gave the students resources to develop their implementations, such as databases and exclusive MatLab resources.

This year, 16 groups from Ecuador, Mexico, Honduras, Costa Rica, Colombia, Peru, and India, competed during the Hackathon and 8 of them advanced to the final phase. After a round of presentations in front of a recognized jury, the 3 winners of the first LACCEI Virtual Hackathon were:

1st Place: Avengers, from Ecuador, with their project "Implementation of a monitoring system for electrical parameters such as DC voltage and UPS battery charge percentage to prevent possible interruptions in electrical service using IoT and ThingSpeak"

2nd Place: SASIM+ from Mexico, with their project "Solid waste monitoring through IoT technologies and Matlab"

3rd Place: ElectroGallos from Honduras, with their project "Measurement of water quality of the Lake Yojoa"

We would like to congratulate our winners of the first LACCEI Virtual Hackathon and, encourage students to participate in future LACCEI Hackathons.
